Homecoming Sunday at historic Providence Presbyterian Church offers a time for reflection and recollection of the more than 254 years of history on Providence Road.

- We will remember founding fathers and strong-willed mothers who traveled down the Great Philadelphia Wagon Road and settled here.
- We will remember Alexander Craighead preaching on the rock to these early settlers and William Richardson who was the first installed pastor of Providence.
- We will remember with pride that three of Providences members were signers of the Mecklenburg Declaration of Independence.
- We will remember the stories of Providence such as the woman at the old "Billy Rea place" who upon being told to bring water from the well for British Colonel Tarleton drew the water, walked over and instead of giving it to him to drink, threw in his face.

- We will remember that Providence Presbyterian Church almost baptized a United States President - James K. Polk, whose father though would not confess the faith and so Reverend Wallis would not proceed with the baptism ceremony.
- We remember the oldest grave on the big rock side of the rock wall is dated 1764.

- **We will remember the enslaved African-American members and participants who worshiped and served at historic Providence Presbyterian Church.**
- **We will read their names as their presence and contributions to this church (and to subsequent churches which they founded such as the *Jonesville AME Zion* and *Matthews Murkland Presbyterian* churches) will never be forgotten.**
